14th ANNUAL VETERANS INVITATIONAL RIFLE COMPETITION

In years past, the winning rifle team took home the "traveling trophy" and returned with it the following year so that when a different team won, the new winning team would take it home that year, and so on... That travelling team trophy has been retired and is on display in a very nice display case at American Legion Boots-Dickson Post 174 in Palmyra, MO. Come by and see it any time.

RIFLE EVOLUTION:

Rifle teams consist of 4 shooters. Their scores will be combined for a final overall team score.

Shooters may use any semi-auto or bolt action US Military issue rifle, or a reproduction of any semi-auto or bolt action US Military issue rifle, utilizing open / iron sights only.

No optics allowed other than spotting scopes during the practice evolution only.

Shooters need to supply their own 12 rounds of ammo for score. They should also bring more rounds to use during the practice evolution. Minimum of 30 total rounds suggested, depending on how confident they are of the zero on their rifle.

Each rifle shooter will be issued 3 targets and as such will have a practice evolution to fire as many rounds as they want in 15 minutes sitting at a benchrest from 50 yards. This is their time to adjust their sights and solidify the zero on their rifle. For score they will have 10 minutes to fire 10 rounds sitting at a benchrest from 50 yards, and later they will also have 5 minutes to fire 2 rounds standing from 25 yards.

No part of the rifle or ammunition magazine may rest on the bench while shooting. Spotters helping to zero their rifle, and spotting scopes are allowed ONLY during the practice round. Spotter may advise and/or physically help with sight adjustments during the practice round. They may not do or say anything to help while a shooter is firing for score.

PISTOL EVOLUTION:

Pistol shooters are competing individually and will be scored separately from the rifle scores. Treat them as two separate events altogether.

Shooters may use any centerfire handgun of their choice (let's steer away from the "pistol braces" on this one). If you don't know what that is, good, you don't have one and won't argue to try and use it. Also, NO RIMFIRE calibers.

On the pistol evolution we **are** allowing the use of optics / dots. There will **not** be separate classes for irons and optic sights, they will compete against one another. Use whatever sights you feel most capable with.

Shooters need to supply their own 30 rounds of ammo for score. They should also bring more rounds to use during the practice evolution. Minimum of 40-50 total rounds suggested, depending on how confident they are of the zero on their pistol.

Each pistol shooter will be issued 3 targets and as such will have a practice evolution to fire as many rounds as they want in 10 minutes standing behind a table at 7 yards. This is their time to make adjustments and solidify the zero on their pistol. For score they will have 5 minutes to fire 20 rounds standing behind a table from 7 yards, and later they will also have 5 minutes to fire 10 rounds standing behind a table from 12 yards. Shooters will not draw from a holster. They will load and make ready on command and assume a modified ready position as demonstrated by an RO, and await the FIRE command from range personnel.

AFTER-ACTION REPORT (AFTER AWARDS HAVE BEEN GIVEN):

-Find range personnel and let us know how we did. Criticism is the best way to let us know what areas we need to improve upon.

-If you have ideas regarding the competition that you would like us to consider for the future, please convey them to us. If you feel like you would be an asset to this mission and would like to help in the future, let us know.
